## **Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF) Update**

#### **Horticulture Workshops**

In March we held a series of Horticulture Workshops funded by the HLF on subjects including What to grow, when and how, Soil and propagation, Bugs, Rotation of crops, diseases and control, Companion planting, Wildlife gardening and flower growing. #### **Project Update**

Unfortunately the wall and path will not be rebuilt this year. It has been postponed to Summer 2018. The Heritage Lottery Fund has agreed an extension to April 2019. Over the last few months Mary has been working closely with Hastings Borough Council, the Structural engineer they appointed and our builder to assess the structure of the wall for the joining of the new build to the existing wall. Two exploration holes were dug to look at the structure of the existing wall and the foundations. The foundations have been found to be sound but extra work needs to be carried out to ensure the build will be secure for the

We are currently planning way markers that will also be installed, designed and made by a local artist that will help people find the garden easier.

## **Sculpture**

Recent visitors to the garden will have noticed a new sculpture that has been kindly donated to the garden by one of our members. It is by Carol Peace who specialises in human form and expressive movement.

## **Replacement Shed - Update**

We lost our wooden shed last year due to a deliberate fire. The Trustees agreed at the last committee meeting to replace with wooden shed and not metal as its primary purpose is for member welfare. One of our members installed a wide shelf in the concrete shed which has increased its storage capacity. An initial quotation is that the wooden shed will cost £600. We are to write to local charities and groups to assist with funding the purchase.
