to de-silt the pond near to the garden door – which could allow for a supply of water even in the driest periods. We will let you know if we need help moving aforementioned silt!

We are ever closer to securing a waterless toilet on site, with planning permission firmly in place

for the installation of a Kazubaloo KL2 waterless toilet. We are now applying for funding from 'Awards for All' and hope to have this excitingly named toilet functioning early next year.
